



## Using MessageBunker With IMAP

You've made a good choice. MessageBunker \*loves\* IMAP. By using IMAP, you will enable MessageBunker to download all your historic email and archive it in exactly the same folder structure that you currently have on your mail client. This then enables the Time Travel feature within MessageBunker, and the ability to restore your mailbox exactly as it was at any point in time.

Using MessageBunker with IMAP is easy. Simply select IMAP when in the 'Add a Mailbox' screen (tick 'Use encrypted (SSL) Connection' for extra security if this is enabled on your server), and enter your login & password (which we will store in encrypted format), and let MessageBunker take it from there.

### Add a Mailbox

MessageBunker works by logging into your email account and making copies of all the email it finds there. To do this you need to tell us how to access the mailbox and where it is stored.

You can add another 39 mailboxes.

#### About Your Mail Server

We'll need to be able to access your server using IMAP or POP3, so if it's a server you own, you may need to make changes to your firewall so we allowed to connect.

**Mail Server**

**Protocol**   Use encrypted (SSL) Connection

Using POP3? Make sure your client leaves messages on the server.

**Port (Optional)**

You only need to enter a port if you are not using the standard port for the chosen service (e.g. 143 for IMAP, 993 for IMAP with SSL).

#### About Your Mailbox

These are the details used to log in to the email account which we make use of to archive your email. We store them safe and sound in our underground data facility.

IMAP is supported by most ISP's email systems, as well as Exchange Servers and Gmail (see separate documents for more details on configuring MessageBunker with these).
